Heartworm disease is a very serious, life-threatening disease of dogs and cats that is transmitted by mosquitoes. The number of cases in Arizona has increased dramatically in the last few years.

Intestinal parasites are fairly common in dogs and cats everywhere throughout the United States. Recent statistics have shown that 99% of puppies and kittens carry at least one intestinal parasite, usually obtained from their mother. Another national study showed that over 35% of shelter dogs and cats carry either hookworm or whipworm. It is also very easy for adult and senior/geriatric dogs and cats to pick up parasites from the environment, especially in pet populated areas, such as dog parks, etc. The potential for us as humans to carry them in on our shoes also exists. **Some parasites can even infect and transmit serious diseases to you and your family, especially children and those who are immunocompromised (ie. pregnant women, diabetics, those with severe allergies, those undergoing chemotherapy, those with rheumatoid arthritis, etc.).**
